

Pupil Premium 2016-2017

Pupil premium funding is described by the government as:

"Additional funding given to publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers" (www.gov.uk)

During 2016-2017 school year we will receive £1320 per pupil for every child who has been eligible for free school meals in the last 6 years. This is approximately £120,000. Our pupil premium strategy will be reviewed termly at our Strategic Development Committee Meeting.
